Sycamore, willow, catalpa, ash—who knows what their true names are? We know only that they are most beautiful in the fall when they are dying. They are craziest when the wind is blowing. In the snow they are holiest.

Maybe what is most precious about them is their silence. Maybe what is most touching about them is the way they reach out to us as we pass.



Our 2016 Lenten Journey begins on Ash Wednesday, February 10, with a 7PM joint worship service with our sister congregations, Zoar Lutheran, Mt. Zion, and St. John's Lutheran, Fredericksburg. There will be the administration of ashes and altar communion by intinction at this service. Rev. Bennett Harris will give the sermon and our Sr. Choir will sing an anthem.

Then traditionally, our congregation had a mid-week Lenten gathering on a Wednesday or Thursday evening that began with a light supper that was followed by a worship and prayer service. In recent years, less and less of our members have been attending this mid-week gathering. The Pastor and the committee have decided the time has come to try something new.

Beginning on Sunday, February 14, and through the Lenten Season, there will be Lenten study and worship on Sundays following our regular morning worship service. At the end of morning worship, Pastor Tony will transition us to the Fellowship Hall where a light lunch will be served by members of the Music and Worship Committee. After eating, there will be Lenten Study and the conclusion of the worship service.

So that you can plan your Sunday, Pastor Tony has promised that these gatherings will not last longer than 12:30. It is our hope that most in attendance at worship will stay for this Lenten gathering.

On Maundy Thursday, March 24th, there will be an evening worship at St. John's. We are planning to have a form of the traditional Jewish celebration of a Seder Meal. Communion will be included at this service.

A Community Good Friday worship service will be planned by the Fredericksburg Ministerium. The time and place of this service has not been determined. The Ministerium meeting had to be rescheduled due to last week's snow storm.

Easter Sunday will be celebrated by St. John's on Sunday, March 27th, beginning at 6:45AM with a Sunrise Service at Cedar Hill Cemetery, and morning worship in the church at 10:30PM.

Our next meeting will be March 7th at 7:00 PM.
