## The Pastor's Voice

Dear Friends.

Our congregation has been grieving recently with the deaths of Elby Myers and Ralph Rudy. I think all of you would agree with me that Elby and Ralph were two of the most gracious and kind gentlemen in the community. They both had a smile on their face and a twinkle in their eyes, which would always make your day! They joined the church triumphant just two hours apart from each other. Their deaths were a prelude for us to the Lenten season. which is a time for us to reflect on life and death as we journey with Christ to the cross.

On the other side of this page is a sheet for you to plan your funeral, which I have shared with you the past two years. Several of you have completed this form, which shows that you were ready to reflect on these issues. Maybe some of you are ready to reflect on these issues now. If so, I hope you will take time to fill out the sheet and return it to me. I will then put it on file at the church. If you have any questions about your

plans, I would be glad to talk with you.

I also want to remind you that regardless of current age or health issues, these are issues that all of us should consider. I experienced this in September when my brother, Keith, died unexpectedly. I am pretty sure that Keith never thought of these issues. All of us can help our families by giving instructions of how we want our lives to be remembered and celebrated when we die. I want you to know that I have thought through these concerns and have planned my funeral service. I did this so that it will be easy on my family when that time comes!

As we continue to go through this Lenten season, I encourage all of you to reflect on the questions found at the end of this newsletter. I would encourage you to include your family in the conversation. On Ash Wednesday, our foreheads were marked with the sign of the cross and we heard the words: Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return. The Lenten

season is a time to reflect on our life and our death. We must take time to reflect on our faith in a loving God whose grace is given to us through Jesus Christ and the strength given to us through the Holy Spirit.

I hope you can join us for our Wednesday evening Lenten services. I hope you can join us for our Bible study each Wednesday at noon. I would invite you to join our online spiritual group. I encourage you to take time every day to be in prayer. I encourage you to visit one of our homebound members or send them a card during this Lenten season. The purpose of the Lenten season is to take something on, which will challenge us in our faith journey.

March 25: Video Rotation: children will view The Little House on the Prairie episode, "The Lord Is My Shepherd." Teacher: TBA


#### A Need from the Christian Education Committee


