We had a Soup Sale on February 22nd and our profit was \$1363.50. Also on March 30th we had an All You Can Eat Breakfast on March 30th and our profit was \$348.01. May 1st we will be starting to sell Krall's Sub Coupons for \$6.50.

We ask our members to pray very hard on this matter and to speak with members of the budget and finance committee or members of Consistory if you have any ideas you would like to share or any suggestions. We need your prayers and assistance more than ever!!


The Music and Worship Committee met on Monday, March 18.

The theme for the Retreat is: Bible Bad Girls, based on several of the women in the book "Bad Girls of the Bible", by Liz Curtis Higgins.


