# PASTOR'S MESSAGE by Pastor Tony LENT

We are now in the Lenten season. Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the Lenten journey. As this season approaches, many think of things to sacrifice and give up. Sadly, many set goals only for the season in the hopes to grow closer to God or the purpose of their life.

During this season, the idea of denying self gratification, life pleasures, or even bad habits for the Lenten season is hard. However, what if God does not want us to just give up things for Lent but for the rest of our lives.

#### Here is Pastor Tony's Top Ten List:

- 1. Give up the fear of failure.
- 2. Move from your comfort zone.
- 3. Being impatient with family, friends, and God.
- 4. Over commitment (remove the cape, practice saying no)
- 5. Apathy
- 6. Complaining
- 7. Destructive speech (Hebrews 10:25)
- 8. Small view of God
- 9. Envy (I am blessed. My self worth is not in things but in my relationship with God) Resistance to change (Change is certain. How will we change is the better question).

Furthermore, what if Lent is not about sacrificing or giving up? What if Lent is more than the ashes on our foreheads, Bible study, Fastnacht Day/ Shrove Tuesday, or eating fish on Fridays? Imagine that Lent is a time of sharpening our understanding of the presence of God in a broken world. Imagine that God wants to empower "His people" to become voices crying in the wilderness. Perhaps in this season God is preparing us to say to our families, communities, churches and society that Christ is

coming to make all things new. Imagine God is inviting us as ambassadors of Christ to share with others that kindness is stronger than cold-heartedness; love is stronger than hate; light is stronger than darkness; truth is stronger than lies, and that conflict and challenge does not rule the day.


Over the last seven years I've buried approximately 30 people, if not more. A few were family members: my aunt (and the Fields' family matriarch), my favorite grandfather, my father, two uncles, and another aunt. I've seen families faced with changing roles in life and children becoming guardians of parents. In addition, walking alongside children dealing with parents as they faced complexities, challenges, and Alzheimer's, dementia, and Parkinson's has changed my perspective of life. Many parishioners are not only concerned with the challenges of family dynamics but also with the disabling changes and access to proper treatment. Getting an accurate diagnosis, finding the best treatment, and managing home care become a struggle for many.

These experiences allow an awareness and appreciation of the frailty of humanity. And amidst all the flashes of injustice and human suffering, maybe God has another remedy for healing a nation. Perhaps during this season, God's agenda is the enrichment of His people. Maybe in this Lenten season as we gaze upon the purple altar cloth and banners in our sanctuary, it will help us rebuild trust not only with one another but also with God. Perhaps in this season, GOD wants us to be aware that He is with us in life's journey.
