

## The Pastor's Voice

Dear Friends,

We are in the midst of the Easter season, which is a time for us to be witnesses of the Risen Christ! We often forget to be a witness to the ways we receive joy and hope through the Risen Christ. As Christians we are people of a Resurrection faith. We must proclaim the good news that death doesn't have the final word, but that through the Risen Christ life triumphs death!

We read at the end of Matthew's gospel of Jesus' Great Commission to the disciples. Jesus says in Matthew 28:19-20, **"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."** As Easter people, we are called to go out and spread the good news of the Risen Christ and shout our Easter alleluias! We

are living in a time where people need to receive a message of hope that can drive away their despair.

The Church must hear the news of Christ's resurrection. There are many congregations that are dying and essentially in hospice care. The problem is that they aren't open to the new possibilities given by God through the Risen Christ and the Holy Spirit. They are clinging on to what they have left and not moving forward in the ministry and mission that God has given to them. They are not being witnesses to the love and grace of Christ. If you were in worship on Easter morning, you heard the great sound of babies and children fill our sanctuary. This is a sign of the new thing that God is doing in our lives. It is a sign of resurrection! It is a witness to the love given to us through the Risen Christ!

On May 20, we will confirm four young people into the life of this congregation. This is a great joy in

the life of a church. We have nurtured these young people throughout their childhood and the confirmation process. They will affirm the vows taken at their baptism and become full members of our congregation. They bring gifts and skills that we will need as we move forward in responding to the Great Commission. I hope each of you will look to these young people as leaders of the church NOW and not wait for them to be leaders in the future. We need them to share their gifts as well as their ideas NOW so that we can have a vital church in the future.

I leave you with the words of an Easter hymn written by Brian Wren: ***Christ is alive and comes to bring good news to this and every age; till earth and sky and ocean ring with joy, with justice, love, and praise.*** Friends, let us boldly proclaim this good news!

**May 20 (7<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter):** We will celebration the Rite of Confirmation and the Sacrament of Holy Communion as we welcome Noah Gingrich, Rachael Quairol, Zach Seltzer, & Dylan Walmer into membership. Our gospel lesson tells of Jesus praying that his disciples, who have experienced the testimony of God through Jesus, will now take on Jesus' ministry with Jesus' God-given mandate. These are important words as we confirm these four young people into the life of our congregation.

**May 27 (Pentecost Sunday):** On this Pentecost Sunday, we are reminded that even in times when it seems difficult and pointless, the power of God's Spirit is active in our lives. How are we experiencing the power of the Spirit? We will focus on this as we celebrate the birth of the Christian Church. We will celebrate pew communion as well as wear something red in celebration of the Pentecost story.

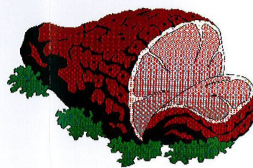

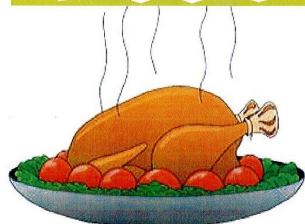

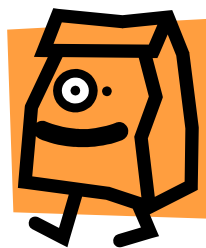
## New Bible Study Series

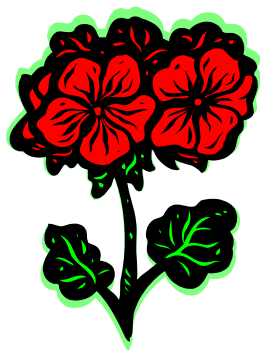
## Lunch with the Pastor
