Pastor Tony's Message

Even if I knew that tomorrow the world would go to pieces, I would still plant my apple tree... '*Martin Luther*.

Here we are in the spirit of celebrating Martin Luther 500th Anniversary Reformation, the idea that changed the world. Amazingly God allowed a reformer named Martin Luther to be a conduit and have an effect on society in the 16th Century which is still relevant today. This reformer whose opposition to the Roman Catholic Church enabled the diverse ways in which we are able to practice Christianity today. We are the living epistles and have an example of a monk whose Spirit- inspired grasp of God's justification of sinners through faith in the Savior was the cornerstone of the Protestant Reformation.

We are moving from All Saints Sunday through Advent to the Birth of Christ. As we continue to live and passionately declare and demonstrate the love nothing should separate us from the love of God. We have seen an unbelievable amount of natural disasters, disunity, and human injustice in our society. And personally I had 14 family members that died or are presently in critical conditions that averages at least 1 per month. And the church must remain faithful in its call. Honestly, I am remaining faithful to my call. These few months I am reminded that there are no sorrows on earth that God cannot heal and yes, with teary eyes.

Personally, I do not just go to church because this is my occupation. I go because like the Apostle Paul according to Romans 8: 38 & 39 For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, [39]: Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, **shall** be able to **separate us from the love of God**, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord. The church is my shelter from the storm. St John's is a place where I worship with God's people in the midst of tragedy by lifting my praise unto God. The church is more than a place that deals with social injustice, bad habits, addictions, social failures, psychological deficiencies, and broken relationships. We need to steer humanity back to theological issues. We must help people to understand their use of spiritual gifts. Our job is to remind those we come in contact with of the theological principle that "God is with us" and "God is Still-speaking."

Let us get back to helping those within our community repair their relationship with God. Let our passion help first ourselves then others do their vocation well. In the words of Martin Luther, "Even if I knew that the world would go to pieces, I would still plant my apple tree. My hope is built on nothing but Jesus Christ and his righteousness. For me the hymns, we sing are not just familiar words but also lively chords vibrating in the heart of our existence.

We have contracted this service for a trial to see if there is sufficient interest to make it an ongoing outreach for St. John's. To get a better idea of the goals of this program, here are some thoughts from the company president, Brian Mosley:

Financial Report by Robin Getz, Finance Chair

Total Revenue (1/1/17-9/30/17) \$76,159.92 Total Expenses (1/1/17-9/30/17) \$79,356.75

We need to collect \$1750.00 weekly to meet budget and currently we are averaging \$1,752.12 per week through September 30th. The Consistory has taken over the fundraising projects and has a number of fundraisers schedule throughout the year. So far this year the 3 fundraisers (2Soup Sale & Pancake Breakfast) netted 2067.81 & we have received \$185.00 to date from our Dine & Donate at Esther's Restaurant. In June the Golf Outing netted \$2079.00. They had a Chicken BBQ on October 28th and to date netted \$2206.72 however there are still a few outstanding bills & will have a booth at the Northern Lebanon Band Parents Bazaar on November 25th.

I want to thank the Consistory for working so hard at the fundraisers. We are over half way to our budgeted figure to the current date.

We must continue to look to outside sources to close the budget gap. We ask our members to pray very hard on this matter and to speak with members of the budget and finance committee or members of Consistory if you have any ideas you would like to share or suggestions. We need your prayers and assistance more than ever!!
