PASTOR TONY'S MESSAGE

MORE NOW THAN EVER

1 Corinthians 16:13-14 (NRSV)

Keep alert, stand firm in your faith, be courageous, and be strong. ¹⁴Let all that you do be done in love.

The Apostle Paul gives this concluding exhortation in his epistle to the Corinthians. It is good advice for us today too. The Apostle gives 5 commands to his readers; be alert, stand firm in your faith, be courageous, be strong, and let all you do be done in love.

May these words become more than rhetoric as we lace our boots to fight the good fight of faith. As we live in what seems to be whirlwind times of social change, let us remember we have a "charge to keep (call by God)" and a God to glorify. Living in these times as Christians, especially as we hear the ugliness of social and political changes, these scriptures give us purpose.

As we reflect and lend our ears to the conversations of these issues that we must remain grounded in the reign of God rather than live in fear. As Christians we must think through and make sense of all the fears and anxieties of the rapid changes in society no matter if the disputes are issues of abuse of police authority, global warming, gun laws, immigration, Isis, racism or patriotic loyalty we must remind ourselves that conflict and challenge do not rule the day.

Furthermore, as we move into our nation's most controversial debates, we cannot afford to waver and allow social polarization. Our voices and actions must align themselves as we become a congregation that passionately declares and demonstrates the courageous love of Christ (Penn Central Conference).

Our shoeboxes are gathered – now it's time to work on filling them! Please remember that Samaritan's Purse will not ship liquids of any kind, and does not allow any kind of war-related toy to be shipped.

The basics that are packed into each of our boxes are a bar of soap, a washcloth, a toothbrush and a tube of toothpaste, pencils, erasers, pencil sharpeners, a box of crayons, a tablet or notebook, and a bag of candy. There are many kinds of items that will make our boxes bring lots of smiles – balls, activity books, markers, socks, sunglasses, flashlights, small toys and games, toy cars, dolls, and stuffed animals.

Our boxes go to children ranging in age from 2-14, so a wide variety of gifts will allow them to be distributed to kids of all ages. Please remember that any item you purchase must be small enough to fit inside a shoebox, so that it may be properly packed and shipped.

In addition to the items we gather to fill our boxes, we will also be soliciting sponsorship of the boxes we send. Each box requires a \$7 donation for shipping. Since we have been able to fulfill our sponsorship needs in a timely way in the past, we could attach a specific label that allows them to be tracked during the distribution process. That way we have been notified of their final destinations. Look for the small brown envelopes in the pews to make your donation for this purpose.

Our gathering of gifts and sponsorships will begin in earnest during the month of October. We will provide weekly updates in church so that everyone is aware of our progress and anything that might still be needed. On **Sunday, November 13**, we will wrap and pack our boxes beginning at 8:30. The boxes will be blessed during morning worship on **Sunday, November 20**, and will be taken to the local collection site in Ono. A group of us will travel to the regional shipping site in the Baltimore/Washington area on **Monday, December 5**, from 2-6 p.m. If you would like to be part of that group, please let us know. This project brings much joy, not only to the children receiving our gifts, but also to those of us who have a hand in the process. We ask for your participation, support, and prayers, as we prepare for another season of giving.

Financial Report by Robin Getz, Finance Chair

Total Revenue (1/1/16–8/31/16) \$ 61,990.83 Total Expenses (1/1/16–8/31/16) \$ 75,215.97

We need to collect \$1923.07 weekly to meet Morning Worship budget and currently we are averaging \$1,771.16 per week. As you can see, we are running behind projections by \$151.91 plus dollars on a weekly average basis. There is a serious concern with our ability at meeting budget over the 2016 year which will result in utilizing more of our cash reserves than anticipated, shortening the life bread of our church. When the budget was presented at the congregational meeting held in November 2015, we were very clear that the continual shortfall would continue to be detrimental to the church's financial health. We truly need to consider ways to either raise revenue through solid fundraising (and not just the committee of 5) OR look at ways to cut expenses which will mean some truly tough choices as there really is not "fluff" in the approved budget. We need your prayers and assistance more than ever!!

The Financial Committee is always diligent with monitoring expenses. I am thankful for the dedication of the members and their continued efforts. Note: We are always looking for members to serve and, if there is any interest, they can contact me.
