#### LENTEN BIBLE STUDY

Entering the Passion of Jesus—By Amy-Jill Levine

Jesus' final days were full of risk. Every move he made was filled with anticipation, danger and the potential for great loss or great reward. Jesus risked his reputation when he entered Jerusalem in a victory parade. He risked his life when he dared to teach in the Temple. His followers risked everything when they left behind their homes, or anointed him with costly perfume. We take risks as we read and re-read these stories, finding new meanings and new challenges.

In Entering the Passion of Jesus the author explores the biblical texts surrounding the Passion story. She shows us how the text raises ethical and spiritual questions for the reader, and how we all face risk in our Christian experience. The book provides a rich and challenging learning experience for small groups and individual readers alike. The book's six chapters include: 1. Jerusalem: Risking Reputation;

2. The Temple: Risking Righteous Anger; 3. Teachings: Risking Challenge; 4. The First Dinner: Risking Rejection; 5. The Last Supper: Risking the Loss of Friends; & 6. Gethsemane: Risking Temptation.

#### Financial Report by Robin Getz, Finance Chair

Total Revenue (1/1/19–1/31/19) \$ 5,965.64 Total Expenses (1/1/19–1/31/19) \$ (8,792.18)

We will need to collect \$1557.69 weekly to meet budget currently we averaged \$1436.25 per week through January 31st. However we had no service one Sunday due to the weather. As explained at the last Congregation Meeting we will truly need to consider ways to raise revenue through different Fundraisers to assist with balancing the budget. We will have to have fundraising Projects to help bring in extra funds. We had a Soup Sale on February 22nd and it went very well. 178 quarts of soup were sold. All the bills are not in to date to have a profit on the soup sale. The bake sale made \$120.50. An All You Can Eat Breakfast is scheduled for March 30th from 7AM-11:30PM and sub sale will be held the beginning of May.

We ask our members to pray very hard on this matter and to speak with members of the budget and finance committee or members of Consistory if you have any ideas you would like to share or any suggestions. We need your prayers and assistance more than ever!!

The Financial Committee is always diligent with monitoring expenses. I am thankful for the dedication of the members and their continued efforts. Note: We are always looking for members to serve and, if there is any interest, they can contact me.
