Consistory News by Charlene Ziegler

Consistory Held their regular meetings August 29 and September 26, 2022.

Prior to the start of the business meeting on August 29, Robin Gingrich and Dena Eberhart, members of the Social Hall Committee, presented the vision for the future Social Hall.

The plan is for a Communication Center as you enter the space, a gathering area, a coffee area and a Sunday School section. The ladies presented options for furniture for the specific areas except for the school section which will use the current tables and chairs. Prices were presented for the specific items.

A motion was made to use money from the Memorial Funds to pay for the purchase. The purchase will include 8 chairs, 4 table sets and a "fireplace". The color scheme will be light blue on three walls with the fourth wall a darker blue. Exact shades will be chosen after furniture arrives. The floor will be "wood" laminate.

Ernest Zserai was available to answer questions regarding his company's estimate. He would plan on starting the work late October/early November with a finish date by Thanksgiving. An agreement was signed with Zserai Construction.

Volunteers have been busy doing some of the demolition work.

Other events for St. John's discussed at the meetings were Rally Day September 11, the fall Flea Market and Bake Sale September 23 and 24, the start of Sunday School on September 25. Harvest Home will be on October 16 and a Chicken Barbeque will be held on October 22. Items will be collected for Operation Christmas Child again this year.

Holiday worship services are set through the end of the year.

Julie Ditzler informed the Consistory that the historic records for St. John's are stored at the Lancaster Seminary with records from other churches. She was informed they are running out of storage space and are opting to send the records out of state to be stored. She would like to have the records remain in our possession. Consistory told Julie to bring the records back to the church.

The Consistory will be reviewing the proposed budget for 2023 at the next meeting

The next Consistory meeting will be held October 31, 2022 at 7 p.m. Consistory meetings are open to all members of St. John's and members are more than welcome to attend.
